
Introduction

- Trainee is required to undertake a audit or project during there fellowship


Methods



Important considerations for those interested in the BAPRAS/BAAPs

Aesthetic Fellowship

- Income: The Fellowship comes with an award of £8000. This is paid over three installments during the fellowship. Importantly this educational bursary non-taxable. It is not a payment for services but simply to cover your costs whilst you obtain further practical experience in your field.
- Indemnity: As there is no NHS work and you are post-CCT, this
 fellowship is not covered by standard trainee (ST) level of cover.
 MPS provided the best quote of £156.25 for 3-months but with no
 allowance for any private income. Other defense unions ranged
 from £1200-6248 per annum (as of Jan 2018)

Choosing your mentor

- The fellowship is available at the following locations
 - Newcastle
 - London
 - Edinburgh
 - Hull
 - Salisbury
- When choosing your location important considerations are
 - Patient population will the practice have lots of VIP patients who will not want you observing
 - The balance of cosmetic vs NHS choose and book vs reconstructive
 - Does the surgeon have a surgical assistant?
 - Anatomical areas of cosmetic surgery performed

The Aesthetic Fellowship with Mr Riaz

- Large single surgeon volume practice with excellent links with colleagues
- 95% cosmetic patients in private practice
- All aspect of cosmetic surgery covered ability to meet certification in all areas
- Support in arranging visits to other units and surgeons in UK Huge amount of emphasis on seeing patients post-op and at all their clinic appointments to gain insight into their concerns and expectation as the results develop
- Track record in teaching his innovative surgical techniques such as r-facelift to colleagues.
- Team of secretarial and theatre staff and hospitals all used to trainees and observerships

Results

- 3 months fellowship from February 2018 May 2018
- All clinics and theatre sessions were cosmetic
- Occasional cosmetic evenings were attended
- Fellowship was run from three different hospitals
 - Spire Hull
 - St Hugh's Grimsby
 - Park Hill, Doncaster
