We are looking to appoint a new fellow into our long-running Senior Fellow position at the Manchester Adult Burns Centre (Wythenshawe Hospital) and the Manchester Paediatric Burns Centre (Royal Manchester Children's Hospital). The fellowship, which has been running for over ten years, would be suitable for senior trainees who hold the FRCS(Plast) and are looking to develop advanced skills in the management of adult and paediatric major burn injuries, as well as receive mentorship as they finish their training and prepare for a role as a consultant surgeon.

The Adult Regional Plastic Surgery Unit at MFT consists of a 16 bedded Plastic Surgery Ward and a 12 bed Burns Ward. There is also access to paediatric beds. The Paediatric Regional Burns Centre consists of a 10 bed Burns Ward. We have access to theatres in day case surgery as well as inpatient theatres. There is also a dedicated burns theatre on each site. Each Consultant has been appointed to develop a specific speciality within Burns and Plastics and the Consultants, therefore, are able to offer a wide range of training to junior staff. The Unit has been able to develop a special interest in hand and wrist surgery, congenital abnormalities, trauma and elective surgery, burns, neoplasm resections and microsurgical breast reconstruction, facial reanimation, limb re-plantation and reconstruction.
